From the classroom


This semester we have explored numbers and place value. It has been wonderful to see students master addition and subtraction using learnt strategies. However, it was just as rewarding watching our senior student understand algebra, the frustration was real. Other learnings included Time, Budgets, statistical data and representations.

In English the students researched a topic and delivered an Informative report presentation to the class. The students were able to utilise new computer skills learnt to add a multimodal element to their presentations. We have all enjoyed learning about Dinosaurs, Bees, Dogs and Earthquakes.

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
